

Part One – You and your household (completed by all respondents)




1. Is this your main home?

The vast majority of responses (96%) came from people whose main home was in Arnside. Those who responded regarding a second home were not required to answer any further questions about their home or their housing need.

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
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2. How would you describe your home?

The majority of homes are houses (55%) and bungalows (32%). There were a small number of responses (3 - making up less than 1%) from people in sheltered or retirement housing.




3. Please confirm the type of house.


Almost 53% of houses are described as detached, 30% semi-detached and 12% terraced. Of the 24 'other' descriptions, 8 said they lived in an apartment block.

Not all gave details.



4. How many bedrooms does your home have?

40% of homes have 3 bedrooms, with 24% having four or more bedrooms. Less than 3% are 1 bed or bedsit accommodation.




5. Who owns your home?

By far the greatest number of homes are owned outright by a household member (80.5%), with the ownership via mortgage or loan being the second most common at almost 14%. Combined together the rented options (from council, from housing association and private landlord) make up less than 5% of responses.

6. How many families are living in this dwelling?


19 responses indicated that their home had more than one family in it. Some of these were not supported by the information provided about who is resident in the property, but from the information provided it is reasonable to assume that around 13 households (or 2.5%) are made up of more than one family.



7. How many years have you lived in the parish?

There is a wide range of response to this question from only a few months to more than 90 years. A noticeable minority have never lived anywhere else.


8. Please complete the table to show the age and gender of all those living in your home.



From this information we can see how many people are resident in each household. The vast majority are single occupancy or couples with no children.


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
Of those 26 who have moved away, 15 would like to return to Arnside if suitable housing becomes available.

11. Do you, or does anyone living with you wish to move to a new home, either open market or affordable?




24% of respondents anticipate the need for someone in the household to move either within the next 5 years or in more than five years. This could be for an open market move or a home for affordable rent, indicating how much movement there could be overall. 76% do not wish to move in the foreseeable future.

12. If you answered 'yes' to question 11, please specify where you would be looking to move to.




Of the 115 people who anticipated a house move in the previous question, almost 73% (80 of them) wish to stay in the parish of Arnside.

13. If a need should be identified, would you be supportive of a small development (typically 4-8 homes) of affordable homes for local people?




The majority (85%) would support a small development of affordable homes for local people, if the need should be identified.

14. Would you remain supportive for a development (typically 4-8 homes) that is primarily affordable housing for local people, or those with connections to the parish, but also includes a number of open market homes?




Fewer people – but still a significant majority at 69.5% – would support a mixed development of affordable homes with the possibility of cross-subsidy from sale of open market homes.

40% of respondents supported housing developed for open market sale.


Community Led Homes



16. Would you be supportive of a Community Led Housing project (not for profit)?


75% said they would support 'not for profit' Community Led Housing development. 25% would not.

17. Would you or a member of your household be interested in being personally involved in a community led housing scheme?



8% would be interested in being involved in a Community Led Scheme. This is potentially 39 people from the 78 households who identify themselves as in housing need.

18. Would you or a member of your household be interested in joining a community groups, such as Community Land Trust or a Community Benefit Society, to ensure local people have a central role in any future affordable housing development?




Almost 12% of respondents were interested in joining a community group to establish a community led approach.

19. Can you suggest a site/location in the parish where such development could be built?

Places which get mentioned repeatedly in this response include: Briery Bank (aprox 48 mentions) Station Road (aprox 33 mentions), Redhills Road (aprox 31 mentions) Black Dyke Lane (aprox 17 mentions) and Hollins Lane (aprox 11 mentions).

There are several comments about places which are already allocated or which have been purchased for housebuilding already. People have also taken the opportunity to say that they do not think there are any sites which could be developed for housing (31).

People indicated a wide and general need when thinking about the type of homes which would benefit the parish.

They were encouraged to indicate more than one type of housing if they wanted to. Housing for younger people, family homes and homes for affordable/social rent were the most supported types of housing for 314, 272 and 211 people respectively.

The spread of interest here suggests that diversity in the housing offer is important, with some support for every single sort of housing on the list including live/work units and self-build plots for instance.


As we would expect, the comments in the responses make varied, sometimes opposing points.

There is a strong, but minority, feeling that there is no need for further development with a range of arguments for this position. Comments about spoiling what is attractive about the area, homes sitting empty and development not being effectively protected for local need all come through.

Stronger messaging from the comments acknowledges that there is a need for housing to meet the needs of the community. People are concerned about the lack of affordability in the area for young people and those on low incomes. They are also concerned about the demographics; this is expressed as wanting homes which are good for an aging population, and wanting to encourage younger people to settle so that the community remains mixed to sustain the range of services.

Finishing part 1 of the survey, 16% of people said they were in housing need and went on to fill in Part 2, detailing their housing need. These 78 people include those who want to move outside the area and who will move within the housing market, as well as those who need affordable or specialist housing.


22. When do those requiring a new home need to move from this home?

25 people said they will need to move in the next 2-5 years, with a further 23 people expecting to move in more than 5 years. The more immediate need was 11 people who want to move now, and 15 who need a new home in the next 2 years.




38 of the 74 people who answered the question want to buy on the open market. 6 people were interested in self-build or custom-build opportunities. 20 people want to rent across all private and affordable sectors, including 6 who want shared ownership (part own, part rent). 5 were specifically interested in the new 'first homes' model.




25. What type of accommodation would meet your needs?

26. How many bedrooms do you need?




Half of the respondents (37) need a 2 bedroom home. 17 need 3 bedrooms and 7 need 4. 12 people are looking for a home with 1 bedroom.

- Struggle with stairs. Bungalow would be ideal.

- Physical disability.







29. Age and gender of people in the new home.




This graph shows that the majority of need identified is for older couples and for single people and couples under 30.



30. What type of household will the new household be?





Of the 70 people who told us their annual income, 27, or 39%, earn less than £20,000 per year.

21% of respondents earn more than £50,000 per year, including 11% who earn more than £61,000.

34. Do you have any savings which may be used to contribute towards the cost of a new home?






