
Dear friends,

Over the last few years around Easter the BBC has produced a programme called 'Pilgrimage' which invites people (admittedly some more well-known than others) from different walks of life and sends them on a pilgrimage to well-known Christian sites around Europe. Whereas in previous years pilgrims have journeyed to Santiago de Compostela, Rome and Fatima, this year the producers invited the celebrities to journey along the Pilgrim's Way in North Wales. A route beginning in Holywell at the well of St Winifred (a Welsh Christian martyr of the seventh century) and then travelling east to Bardsey Island, the so-called 'island of twenty-thousand saints'.

What makes the programme so fascinating is the window it shines on the spirituality and faith of the pilgrims, who intentionally represent a variety of religious (and non-religious) perspectives. Naturally, this leads to some interesting and diverse conversations, and yet — watching the programme — it is fascinating to see the pilgrims' openness of heart and mind to seeing where the journey will take them, setting aside time for conversations with each other, but also often with God.

In the earliest days of the Church, as we are reminded in the Acts of the Apostles, those who came (eventually) to call themselves Christians, were initially known as those who 'belonged' or who 'followed' 'The Way'. From the very beginning there was a sense that the Christian community understood itself to be part of something that was dynamic and unpredictable and, quite literally, 'on the move'. They recognised that to live one's life in responses to the promises of God, and particularly, the good news that the early Church proclaimed had been seen so clearly in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth, was to join a movement. A movement that in centuries past, and still today, has the power to bring about transformation, that changes lives and, in doing so, changes the world.

The ability of the Christian community, in every place and time, to do this isn't based on its material success, status or social preeminence (even if sometimes the Church has wrongly prioritised these things), but rather on the hope it seeks to live out of and the message it has been commissioned to proclaim. In the stories we find in the gospels of the post-resurrection appearances of Jesus, we are reminded repeatedly that those he encountered didn't naturally find it hard to believe what they were seeing. Whether it's the women at the empty tomb, the bewildered travellers on the road to Emmaus, or the disciples cowering behind locked doors in Jerusalem, the Bible doesn't



shy away from showing us that believing is sometimes difficult. And that, whatever our age or stage of life, the secret of faith is a willingness to open out hearts to the possibility of what God can, will and does do.

The Victorian writer, G.K. Chesterton, commenting on the ups and downs of Christian history, once wrote:

'Christendom has had a series of revolutions and in each one of them Christianity has died. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave.'

I pray that as you journey through the month ahead, you may know God's guidance and grace, know the joy of his risen presence, and so find faith to continue, or perhaps to start, walking in his way.





### Arnside National School Headteacher, Mr N. Sharp



As the summer term approaches, you can't but reflect on how fast the academic year has flown. Our older pupils have had their secondary school choices confirmed and the final few months is the perfect chance to fluff their feathers before flying the primary nest. But before the excitement of transition, there is a term packed with exciting lessons, activities, residentials and performances. A perfect way to end.

The Easter term culminated in a wonderful 'Stations of the Cross' walk. Ian Service, Chair of Governors, proudly led the whole school around the village, linking the Catholic and Methodist Churches together and finishing at St James'. At each station, the pupils retold and reflected on different aspects of the Easter journey, accompanied by a reading and song. Thank you to all involved and especially our friends from the Catholic and Methodist Churches who made us feel so welcome. The day was finished with a special Celebration Worship in St James' where end of term awards were presented and pupils' personal achievements were praised and celebrated. This regular event is a fantastic opportunity to highlight the vast array of successes and accomplishments outside school – the pupils are amazingly multi-talented!

The Year 3 & 4 residential to Ingleton was a huge success and the intrepid explorers explored, walked, climbed, and caved their way through the Yorkshire Dales. After trips away from home, it's wonderful to see the pupils walk that little bit taller; the journey towards independence is certainly a unforgettable one for both the pupils and adults. I would like to extend a huge thank you to staff, parents and volunteers that gave up their time to plan, assist and deliver a memorable few days away.

The whole school recently celebrated a special Science Day which involved the classes testing and experimenting the hypothesis, 'Do taller pupils run faster?' After a fascinating day collating evidence and scrutinising results, the pupils gathered in the hall to conclude the activity. In many cases, height was a contributing factor, but it was decided that there were more important aspects which could make a difference. Performing simple 'fair tests' is a fundamental component of the science curriculum, and it underpins much of the fascinating, practical work in school.

Come, still your hearts, let troubles go For you believe in Me, And I am with you, I will show The way ahead of thee.




# Annual Parochial Church Meeting
