Letter from the Parsonage, Beetham

Dear friends,

One of my favourite writers, as the season of Advent gives way to Christmas, is the twentieth century poet and teacher Ursula Askham Fanthorpe, who writes with humour, insight and faith about the celebrations soon to be upon us.

Her poem, 'Angels Song' encapsulates this well, in which she reflects not only on the response of the angel host to the events of the nativity, but seeks to understand and frame this within the bigger story of where Jesus' life will ultimately lead.

Intimates of heaven,
This is strange to us,
The unangelic muddle.
The birth, the human fuss.

We sing a harder carol now:
Holy the donkey in the hay;
Holy the manger made of wood,
Holy the nails, the blood, the clay.

The reference to 'unangelic muddle' and 'human fuss' particularly struck me in contemplating all that the coming weeks will hold as we look ahead to the festivities, fun and frenzy that accompany our keeping of this most special time of the year. Not least since, for so many, 'muddle' and 'fuss' are perhaps apt

descriptors for how we are usually encouraged (by our wider society and culture) to approach the Christmas period; not least when we consider the unhelpful pressure and sense of false materialist and consumerist expectation that so many feel as we near the twenty-fifth of December.

It is then - quite understandably amidst the 'muddle' and 'fuss' of our lives that we approach and enter the weeks of Advent. That particular moment in the church's year for looking at ourselves and our world a bit more closely and so - in that act of looking - to realise how much we need a Saviour. A time for recognising that things (if we need a reminder) are 'not as they should be' and that instead of remaining detached, separate and isolated from human experience and the everyday circumstances of our lives, God is not simply merely interested but actively involved and fully committed. For such is the hope and promise to be discovered in the manger of Bethlehem, in the 'muddle' and 'fuss' of a human birth, where the Lord of heaven and earth draws close to us in love, grace and mercy.

For many people it can often seem easier to believe in evil rather than in God. Yet, in the acknowledgement of evil and wrong, seen in the brutality, fear and injustice of our daily news - in the reality of war and poverty, in the cries of the

of war and poverty, in the cries of the poor and the oppressed, in the sorrows of the marginalised, the isolated and the unloved - then you may be able to understand why we need a Saviour. One who comes not as the result of human endeavour, but as the pledge and proof of a faithful God who loves the world, and loves each and everyone of us, so very much.

This is the truth that lies waiting for us at the close of our Advent journey, as with angels, shepherds, wise-men we are drawn - just like countless generations - to kneel in wonder, joy and adoration before the child of Bethlehem, the Word made flesh, the Saviour of the world. The God who meets us in the 'muddle' and 'fuss' of life and tell us we are never alone.

As the carol, simply but effectively, puts it:

And he feeleth for our sadness, and he shareth in our gladness.

With every good wish and prayer this Advent and Christmas.

St James members can you bring in on Sunday 30th November and December 14th. You can also leave offerings at back of church below Food Bank board.


Financial donations also welcome (cheques preferred). I will be taking all boxes to King's Food Bank immediately to give time to deliver before Christmas.




